- 4 composition notebooks

- Two 1½ inch binders
 - **Must have clear view pocket on the front & back**
 - **One binder for reading and one binder for math**
- 2 packs of 5 pocket dividers with tabs
- 1 **yellow** plastic duo-tang folder with 3 prongs and pockets
- 2 packs of wide-ruled paper
- 1 box of crayons or twistable crayons
- 1 box of #2 pencils
 - 5 pre-sharpened pencils are **required in class daily** or mechanical pencils with extra lead and erasers
- 1 pencil sharpener with a lid

- Create a PowerPoint book report. Include information on each slide such as main characters, setting, important events, and conclusion.

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Math Assignment



Students are **REQUIRED** to achieve **100% fact fluency in multiplication and division** on Reflex Math upon entering 4th grade. Data has proven that students who are proficient with basic facts are scoring higher, and growing faster than their peers. Reflex Math is the resource that M-DCPS and George W. Carver Elementary School utilizes to master their basic math facts as a prerequisite upon entering their grade level.

This mandatory assignment will be **counted as a grade on the first week of school** based on the following grading scale:

- 90% - 100% Fact Fluency – A
- 80% - 89% Fact Fluency – B
- 70% - 79% Fact Fluency – C
- 60% - 69% Fact Fluency – D
- 0% - 59% Fact Fluency – F

*Students transitioning from private and/or charter schools, without previous access to Reflex Math, will be assessed on their math fact fluency on the **first week of school**. Please make arrangements to ensure that your child is prepared.*
